The ceremony is divided into three parts, the *Prelude*, the *Processional* and the *Recessional*. The *Prelude* sets the mood for your ceremony as the guest arrives and is seated prior to the ceremony. You may choose the traditional sounds of classical music, light jazz or love song theme for this portion.

The *Processional* music is played for the Bridal party and attendants as they make their way down the isle. This usually includes Parents, and Groom. Traditonal music for this section includes "Canon" by Pachelbel or "Trumpet Voluntary" by Clarke. As the Bride makes her arrival the classic selection of the "Bridal Chorus" or "Here Comes The Bride" can be played. However you may choose a selection more informal such as "Going To The Chapel" by the Dixiecupps.

The *Recessional* is played at the conclusion of the ceremony, as the bridal party members, including bride and groom depart down the isle. The tradional song is the "Wedding March" by Mendelssohn or "Simon Tov and Mozel Tov", an informal choose might be "I Feel Good" by James Brown.

The important thing to remember is, this is your Wedding you may choose to go tradional or not, just have fun with you music selection, this portion does set the mood for the remainder of the reception.
